Second Jeremiah Sullivan Memorial Lecture "The Strategies of Terrorism"

In his latest book, John Lynn argues that radical sub-state terrorism should be considered as a kind of war. In this lecture, he will examine four strategies pursued by terrorist groups: intimidation, initiation, attrition, and evolution. Lynn insists that since radical terrorism attempts to exert a large psychological impact through the commission of relatively small-scale physical violence, terrorism is fundamentally psychological warfare, a weaponizing of the emotions, that is best countered through knowledge, understanding, and perspective.
